

Competition Guide



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1.COVID – 19 Important information

After consultation with the Athletes Council, Participation Development Committee, Boccia Canada Council and conducting a survey of participants from the 2023 Defi Sportif, it was clear that there was broad support from boccia stakeholders to follow the lead of World Boccia.

Therefore, the Boccia Canada Back to Boccia Training and Competition Guidelines have been retired, with a few exceptions:

- Single rooms will continue to be provided for officials who are not from the same household at national level competitions. This protocol was kept in place in recognition that masking and distancing are not feasible while sleeping in a standard hotel room.
- Sides will continue to have separate warm-ups in Team and Pairs only

2. Eligibility Criteria

All participants must be members in good standing of an organization that is a provincial partner of the Canadian Cerebral Palsy Sports Association (CCPSA). Athletes must be 15 years of age before January 1st, 2024.

3. Code of Conduct and Consent Forms

3.1 Code of Conduct

The CCPSA <u>Code of Conduct</u> is the standard for all registered participants. All registered participants must review and acknowledge that they will abide by the Code of Conduct for this event.

3.2 Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner Consent Forms

In line with our commitment to create a safe environment for all our participants, on February 7, 2023, CCPSA signed the Office of Sport Integrity

Commissioner (OSIC) Agreement and become a Program Signatory. This means that effective upon signing, any allegation of maltreatment or other prohibited behavior, as defined in the Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent

and Address Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS), against a UCCMS participant of CCPSA must be filed directly with the OSIC.

Boccia Canada is a Signatory of the <u>Abuse-Free Sport Program</u> and has adopted the <u>Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport</u> (UCCMS).

As a Signatory, <u>all participants of any nationally-sanctioned Boccia events, as a condition of participation, must consent and abide by the UCCMS and sign the Abuse-Free Sport Participant Consent Form.</u>

4. Competition Venue



RA Centre

The RA Centre is 5.8 km from the Hampton Inn by Hilton Ottawa Hotel, approximately a 12-minute drive.

4.1 Changerooms

There are 9 accessible changing stalls on the main floor of the venue. One of the universal accessible washrooms has a power change table.

4.2 Courts

There will be 6 competition courts in the Badminton Gym and 3 warmup courts in the RA West Gym. See Technical Package for additional details.

4.3 Equipment Storage

A designated equipment storage area will be available in the RA West Gym near the Warmup area. The storage area will be open to the Warmup area but will be monitored through the day. The RA West Gym will be locked at night.

4.4 Elevator

There is one elevator to access the second floor of the RA Centre. It holds 1-2 wheelchairs. No Championships activities take place on the second floor, but participants could go there to access additional accessible washrooms.

All Championships activities will take place on the ground floor or lower level. Competition courts are on the lower level, accessible by an indoor ramp (no elevator).

4.5 Temperature

The gym temperature ranges from 18-20 degrees Celsius.

4.6 Parking

All venue parking is free. There are two parking lots – West (close to practice courts, classification and lunch areas) and East (close to competition courts). There are 28 accessible parking spots and many general parking spots.

4.7 Washrooms

Main Floor East (closest to Competition Gym)

- 2 universal accessible washrooms (one with power change table)
- 2 universal washrooms with showers

Main Floor West (closest to Warmup Gym)

 2 male + 2 female washrooms with stalls; each with 1 wider accessible stall; Washrooms have paddle door openers

Second Floor (access via Main Lobby elevator)

- 1 accessible washroom (not universal)
- 1 male + 1 female washroom with stalls; each with 1 wider accessible stall

4.8 Wi-Fi

There is public Wi-Fi at the Venue for general use.

Name of the network: #RAGuest

No password is needed.

5. Registered Athletes

The list of registered athletes will be released after registration closes.

5.1 Wild Card Athletes

Athletes registered as individual Wild Cards are not members of the provincial team for their province.

Therefore, Wild Card athletes must wear either their club shirt or a neutral shirt on the field of play. They cannot wear provincial or national team shirts on the field of play.

8. Accreditation

All participants will receive an accreditation badge upon arrival at the hotel. Accreditation must be visible <u>at all times</u>. Athletes are permitted to remove their accreditation on the Field of Play (FOP) during play.

Any participant without a visible accreditation will be refused entry to the Call Room and FOP. NO EXCEPTIONS.

8.1 Lost Accreditation

A limited number of replacement accreditations will be available. Participants who lose their accreditations can contact the Venue Manager to request a replacement. The fee for replacement accreditations is \$30.00.

9. Anti-Doping

Anti-doping control <u>may</u> be administered at this competition. If it is, testing will be conducted by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES). The CCES is the custodian of the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP); the set of rules that govern anti-doping in Canada. The CADP includes several components such as in and out-of-competition testing, education, medical exemptions, and the consequences of doping violations. The CADP is compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code and all international standards.

ATHLETES: As a participant in Boccia, the CADP applies to you. It is important to know that by participating in the 2024 Canadian Boccia Championships, you are subject to the CADP, and accordingly, may be selected for doping control. BC3 Performance Partners are considered athletes under the CADP and as such, may also be selected for doping control.

All doping processes will be in accordance with WADA procedures. The CCES permits requests for adapted procedures for athletes with a disability. If athletes require additional equipment to collect a sample, CCES will have collection equipment on hand, such as catheters, nun's caps or urine bottles. Athletes are also permitted to use their own equipment. Athletes will be required to discard any urine that is in the collection vessel prior to providing their sample at doping control.

The CCES recommends that athletes take the following actions to ensure they don't commit an inadvertent anti-doping rule violation:

Doping Control

- Always comply with a testing request if you are notified for doping control.
 A refusal or failure to comply with doping control procedures, without sufficient cause, may constitute an anti-doping rule violation.

10. Classification

All athletes competing at the Canadian Boccia Championships must be classified. Classification will be conducted in accordance with the 2nd Edition Boccia Canada Classification Rules and the BISFed Classification Profiles (see section 13). Classification will take place at the RA Centre on Wednesday, November 13th, 2024.

IMPORTANT: Athletes being classified must ensure the <u>medical diagnostic</u> <u>form</u> is completed and returned to <u>hbonas@bocciacanada.ca</u> 24 hours before arriving on site for classification. Failure to do so may result in the athlete not being able to compete.

All athletes scheduled for classification will be notified directly with details about the classification process and the items/personnel they need to bring with them.

11. Closing Banquet

One Closing Banquet ticket is included in the registration fee. No paper tickets will be provided – your accreditation is your ticket.

Room Amenities

All rooms have:

- Lowered thermostat controls

These rooms are **not available for direct booking**.

To be considered for an accessible room, please email info@bocciacanada.ca by October 12th. Please indicate whether the request is for a Queen or King accessible room. If submitting more than one request, please prioritize the requests based on need.

The HOC will review all requests and work with the hotel to allocate the accessible rooms.

Officials

Officials will also be staying at the Hampton Inn by Hilton Ottawa. The HOC will book all rooms for officials.

12. Information Desk

16. Cameras

To foster a high-performance environment for athletes, any cameras other than those belonging to national team coaches, media liaison and the official event photographer (e.g. provincial team cameras) must be approved by the Technical Delegate. Once approved, coaches will be allowed to set up their cameras on court BEFORE the matches begin.

Coaches may also film the match from their designated area on court.

17. Awards and Ranking Points

17.1 Medals

Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be given to the top three finishers in each category when there are four or more competitors in the category. Medals will be awarded to BC1 and BC3 Performance Partners.

If there are only three competitors, certificates will be awarded to the third-place finisher.

If athletes from more than one classification are combined due to low registration numbers, one set of medals will be presented for the combined classification.

Wild Card athletes are eligible for medals and ranking points.

17.2 Gilles Henry Spirit of the Games Award

The Gilles Henry Spirit of the Games Award for sportsmanship will be awarded to an athlete at the end of competition.

17.3 Ranking Points

Ranking points will be allocated according to the <u>National Boccia Ranking System.</u>

18. Wheelchair Repair

The HOC is currently working on securing a wheelchair repair contact for the duration of the 2024 Canadian Boccia Championships.
